Enrichment fund for each eligible child	PPG will continue to be used to enable children to take part in activities outside school that may not otherwise have been possible (holiday sports clubs/music tuition/swimming etc.). Financial support has been available for families to support costs of residential trips.	Lack of access to enriching opportunities and experiences. Changes in family circumstances.
Subsidise attendance at Early Birds and Ditchheat Extra	PPG will continue to enable families to increase their working commitment leading to better financial security for the family as a whole. For some children attending Early Birds significantly improved attendance and ensured a settled start to the day.	An increasing number of working parents across the school community.
Additional support for guided reading	Children are able to read in small groups 4x per week with an adult per group. All PP children made progress in reading in the year 2015-16. PPG will continue to be used to improve progress and raise attainment in reading at both KS1 and KS2 SATS for PP children.	Low language levels - some children have difficulties when they arrive in Foundation Stage as identified by a Speech and Language therapist. This leads to social communication difficulties and issues with reading and writing.
Additional TA support in Willow and Cherry for PP children.	TA support targeted at Pupil Premium children provides specific support to PP children, but also enhances the learning	

	experience for all. This will continue to bring attainment in line with national standards in reading, writing and maths.	
Specialist equipment	PPG will be used to provide IT equipment, and Literacy resources etc.	Lack of finances to support aids to learning.
Specialist 1:1 support provided by Higher Level Teaching Assistant (HLTA)	PPG will be used to provide specialist support for PP children, including; Speech and Language, Social Skills and Nurture.	Poor speech and language.
Courses for staff to support specific	This support will enable staff, who support PP children, to receive regular and tailored training.	Lack of expertise amongst staff concerning 'Looked after' and adopted children.
