

Pupil Premium Evaluation 2016 - 17

Pupil Premium: 16 pupils; 11 Free School Meals or Ever 6, 2 Adopted from Care and 3 Service Children

Last year we had 16 children in receipt of Pupil Premium. Over the course of the year (2016/17) numbers changed significantly, with children leaving to be home schooled and attend other schools.

Additional TA hours to support Literacy interventions and intensive support with preparation for Big Writing	£1965	At the end of the summer term 75% achieved Age Related Expectations (ARE) in Reading, 63% in Writing and 69% in Maths.	Continue to monitor needs of children and implement interventions as appropriate.
Enrichment fund for each eligible child	£450	The purpose of this money is to enable children to take part in activities outside school that may not otherwise have been possible (holiday sports clubs/music tuition/swimming etc.). Financial support has been available for families to support costs of residential trips.	Continue into 2017 - 2018
Subsidise attendance at Early Birds and Ditchheat Extra	£900	This action has enabled families to increase their working commitment leading to better financial security for the family as a whole. For some children, attendance at Early Birds has improved attendance and has ensured he has a settled start to the school day.	Continue into 2017 - 2018 Monitor attendance closely
Additional TA support for guided reading	£1000	Children able to read in small groups 4x per week with an adult per group.	Continue 2017 - 2018

Additional TA support in Cherry and Maple for PP children.	£6000	TA support targeted at Pupil Premium children provides specific support to PP children, but also enhances the learning experience for all.	Continue to monitor needs of children and implement interventions as appropriate.
Specialist equipment	£100	Pupil Premium money has been used to provide IT equipment, Literacy resources etc.	This will vary and equipment will be made available as and when needs arise.
Specialist 1:1 support provided by Higher Level Teaching Assistant (HLTA)	£2000	This enables specialist support to be provided for PP children, including; Speech and Language, Social Skills and Nurture.	Use of BVPT to assess and track progress. Continue to monitor needs of children and implement interventions as appropriate.
Courses for staff to support specific, e.g. Attachment training, team teach, SENDCO and SEND governor half day conference	£250	This support has enabled staff, who support PP children, to receive regular and tailored training.	When relevant course become available they will be considered.
PP funding was used to pay for children attending a Poetry Slam.	£110 + travel	This activity provided enrichment and inspiration for PP children already achieving ARE.	Activities which provide exceptional educational experiences will be considered throughout the year.
