EXPLORE

- Who was King Arthur? Was he real?
- What is Glastonbury Tor?
- What local stories are attached to Glastonbury Tor?
- What is Stonehenge, how old is it?
- What is a Ley line? Are they real? Can you plot where they are on a map?
- Who was the 'Witch of Wookey Hole'?
- Go for a walk – can you find physical and human features of your landscape. Take 3 photos of each.
- What does a town need to survive?
- Why do you think there are so many unusual local legends and myths in our area?
- Who was the 'Gurt Wurm of Shervage Wood'?
- What animals and plants are specific to our local area?

CREATE

- Make Excalibur
- Make your own Glastonbury Tor (2-D or 3-D)
- Make your own Stonehenge.
- Make your own Wookey Hole Caves
- Make your own Gert Wurm of Shervage Wood.
- Make your own town with a population of approximately 3000 people – I recommend you do this on paper.
- Create your own GLASTONBURY FESTIVAL!!!

Imagine

- Write your own modern day Arthurian tale.
- Write a mystery story set at either Stonehenge, Glastonbury Tor or another local landmark.
- Write a story about the Wookey Hole Witch.
- Make your own Glastonbury Festival line-up – who would be there?

PRESENT

- Present an argument for the location of Camelot – is it Glastonbury? Is it Cadbury Castle? Is it somewhere else?
- What do you think are the origins and purpose of Stonehenge? Present an interesting History programme about it.
- A nature programme about animals and plants specific to our local area.
- A guide to spotting animal tracks when going on a walk.
- If you have made your own town, make an advert to attract people to visit.
